Gynaecology-Oncology Fast Track Clinic

Your GP has referred you to the Gynaecology Fast Track Diagnostic Clinic for assessment and investigation of the pelvic and abdominal symptoms that you are having. On the appointment day, you may require an ultrasound to aid diagnosis:

Trans-vaginal ultrasound – This test uses sound waves to produce images of organs and structures within your pelvic region. This type of scan is performed by inserting a probe into the vagina in order to view the ovaries and womb clearly. You will be asked to lie on the couch in a similar position to having a smear taken. The investigation feels similar to having an internal examination and is not usually painful.

On arrival at the clinic you will be asked to complete an assessment form of your medical history, which will include:

- Your current problems/symptoms
- Past medical history
- Period history
- Family history of any ovarian/breast/colorectal cancer
- Previous/current treatment for other conditions
- Any allergies

WHAT NEXT?

Following the examination/consultation, you **may** require **some** of the following tests or investigations:

- **Pipelle** – You will be asked to lie on the couch in a similar position to having a smear taken. A fine tube is passed into the womb and a gentle suction is used to remove a sample of cells (biopsy) from the womb lining. The sample is sent to the laboratory for examination under a microscope. The results will usually be ready within a week.
- **CT scan** – This scan takes a series of x-rays which build up a three dimensional picture of the inside of the body.
- **MRI scan** – This scan uses magnetism to build up cross-sectional pictures of the abdomen and pelvic area in your body.
- **Blood tests** – Samples of blood will be taken to check your general health and tumour markers to aid diagnosis.
- **Hysteroscopy & Curettage** – This small operation, under anaesthetic, may be organised at a later date. A thin, flexible telescope (hysteroscope) is passed through the vagina into the womb. This allows doctors to look inside the womb and take tissue samples.

- **Laparoscopy** – A small operation under general anaesthetic may be organized at a later date to look at the ovaries, fallopian tubes, womb and the surrounding areas. A small sample of tissue (biopsy) may be taken for examination under a microscope.

The Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) is available for support and information during the consultation/diagnostic stage. Her role is to be a central point of contact – you can use her for help and advice if needed. If the CNS is not available, the clinic nurse will provide you with her leaflet and contact number (*see front cover*).

You may wish to bring your partner, relative or friend with you for support.
