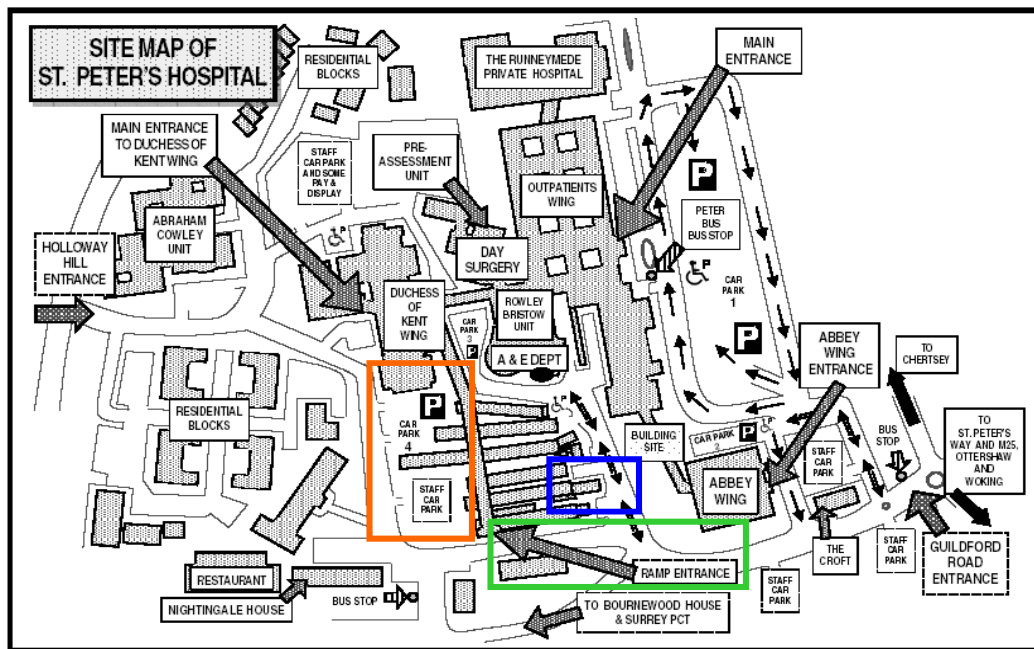

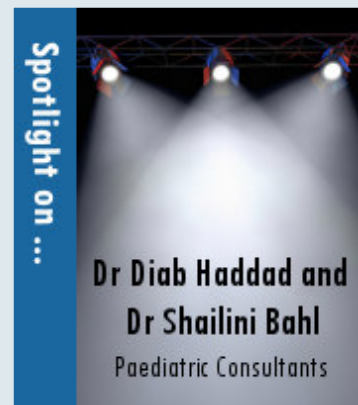

"Spotlight Seminars"

The new Ashford and St. Peter's Hospitals GP and Consultant Networking Group



As you may remember, last month all GPs across our local community were invited to these new and innovative regular events.

Whilst initially intended for GPs, we would like to extend the invitation to all Practice staff (both clinical and administrative) so that the events can be a combination of a Clinical Seminar by Consultants as well as a social and networking opportunity over lunch with the chance to have a workshop style Questions & Answers session about anything regarding the topic of the day - including referral guidelines or process and administration details.

The first of these events is to be held here at **St Peter's Hospital**, in **"The Ramp" Lecture Theatre and Board Room** - with later events to be held at either St Peter's Hospital or Ashford Hospital, Foxhills Country Club as well as at other local venues across the patch.

PARKING and directions for Event Number 1:

I have made special arrangements for you with regards to parking at this event. On the back page of this GP News Bulletin you will find a map. Please park in either of the car parks in the **ORANGE BOX**. The venue itself is in the **BLUE BOX**. One is a staff car park (which you can park in using your permits) or the smaller car park next door is a barrier pay and display.

By displaying your parking permits you do not need to pay and I have made arrangements for security to open the exit barrier for you on request once the event is over. Should you park in either of these car parks, please enter "The Ramp" and the bottom entrance marked by the arrow in the **GREEN BOX**.

Alternatively, please park in the main outpatient car park (again displaying your permits) and come in through the front Main Entrance and use the enclosed map to find your way to the "Ramp Lecture Theatre". Exact directions from the Main Entrance are: go passed the escalator and turn left. Walk a short distance to the end of the corridor and turn right - you are now on the "Main Hospital Street".

Follow the corridor until nearly the end where you will see a sign for "The Ramp" with the entrance on the left hand side. Follow "The Ramp" corridor down the slope until you pick up the temporary signs for the Ramp Lecture Theatre and Board Room and follow these until you reach the venue.
